


FY2012 Financial Summary


Income Source

The income sources for Kupenda are largely made up of general donations given on either an annual or monthly basis. They are not related to any specific fundraising activity or project. The cost of child sponsorship is \$300 a year or \$26 per month online (including an extra \$1 per month to account for internet fees). This amount enables people to sponsor a specific child's education and/or medical needs and receive updates on the child. Adventures for the Cure is our largest organizational partner and therefore has its own category. Campaigns include the Christmas/End of Year Campaign and The Boogie Forever Campaign (Boston Marathon). Fundraising events include Kupenda Dress Down Day at Landmark School, Yappy Hour, Jake Armading Concert, Change for Change, 5 mile race and Ebay Challenge. Earmarked projects include the January and June volunteer trips and Gede School Improvement Project.
